- 1876 Corner stones laid for the new Mount Pleasant School on...  
the 1832 site.<sup>107</sup>
- 1877 Intake Rifle Range Stacksteads was used by L.R.V. before  
this date. A new range was built in 1889 on Greens  
Moor, Stacksteads and used until 1912 when it became  
unfit to use. In 1914 J.H. Brearley Contractor was  
commissioned to build a Government Rifle Range on Green's  
Moor to be used by the local TA. Opened in June 1913.<sup>108</sup>
- 1877 No:6 Branch of the Bacup Co-op. Opened in Market Street.
- 1877 No:7 " " " " " " " " Vale Street.  
Other branches followed in later years.
- 1877 Proposed new bank in Market St./Union St. Bacup. DS. 1878.<sup>109</sup>
- 1877 The new Lee quarry tramway first mentioned; part of  
J.M. Holt's Stubbylee estate. In 1880 it was said to be  
ready.<sup>110</sup>
- 1878 The Public Hall built on the site of the first cotton mill  
in Bacup. Later known as the Kozy Cinema, later still, became  
the Regal Cinema.<sup>111</sup>
- 1878 Victoria WM. Club, began as Bacup WM. Club in King St. later  
moving to Yorkshire St. then to Victoria Hall, Market St.<sup>112</sup>
- 1878 The Bacup Natural History Society inaugurated.<sup>114</sup>
