

- 1820 Map of Brandwood drawn.
- 1820 No less than seven coal pits in the Spotland area.<sup>32</sup>
- 1820/1 Power looms were introduced into the valley.<sup>42</sup>
- 1821 Population for Bacup, Newchurch & Rawtenstall 8,557<sup>33</sup>
- 1821 Irwell Terrace Chapel Built. Rebuilt 1896. Demolished 1977 (1896.RDGaz.17th Oct.)
- 1823 Club Houses built in King St.Irwell St.etc.<sup>35</sup>
- 1825 Fernhill House, Baines records the house, see 1836.
- 1825 North Street Primitive Methodist. Demolished.....  
1952. (BT.9/8/1952)
- 1825 There were eleven carding mills in Bacup. (Newbigging)
- 1826 The power loom riots, mills in Bacup & Stacksteads had.....  
looms broken by the rioters.<sup>42</sup>
- 1826 Road built from Stacksteads, through the Glen to Waterfoot.

- 1829 Building of the first St. Johns school, in Burnley Road. 2nd. School built on site of old one 1908.
- 1831 Population of Bacup 8,000. (BT.28th.Nov.1891)
- 1831 Population for Bacup, Newchurch & Rawtenstall 9,196<sup>30</sup>
- 1832 Heald old School/Chapel built, later changed into cottages C1868.<sup>44</sup>
- 1832 Proposed Reservoirs on the River Irwell, Thomas Ashworth Engineers, Turton, 29th.Nov.1832. (See 1833)
- 1833 Map or plan of Bacup, also of Tunstead & Wolfenden.
- 1833 At this date there was severe distress among the hand loom weavers.<sup>22</sup>
- 1833 Falls of water on the River Irwell & list of mills from its Source to Warrington, by Thomas Ashworth,.....  
engineers, Turton.
- 1834/44 New Line formed. A toll house at Hight Barn.<sup>45</sup>
